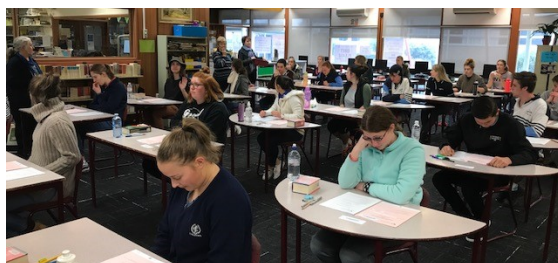
Attitudes to School Survey and GAT

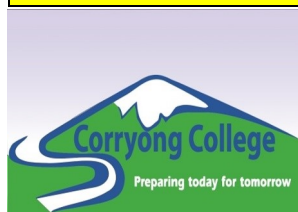

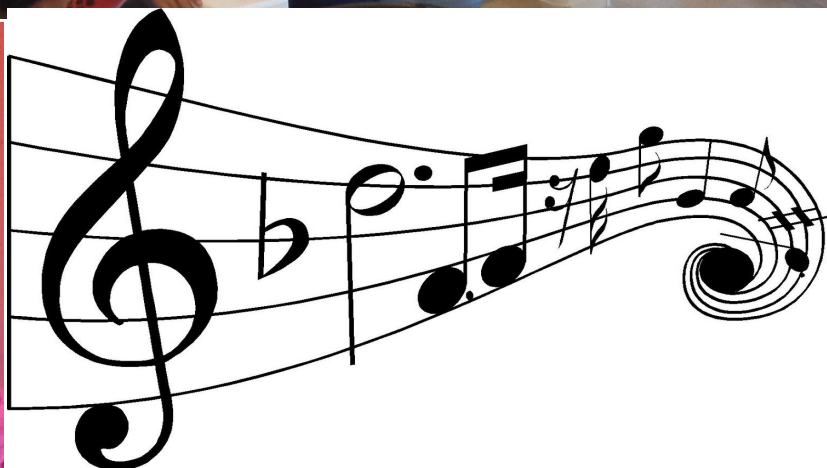

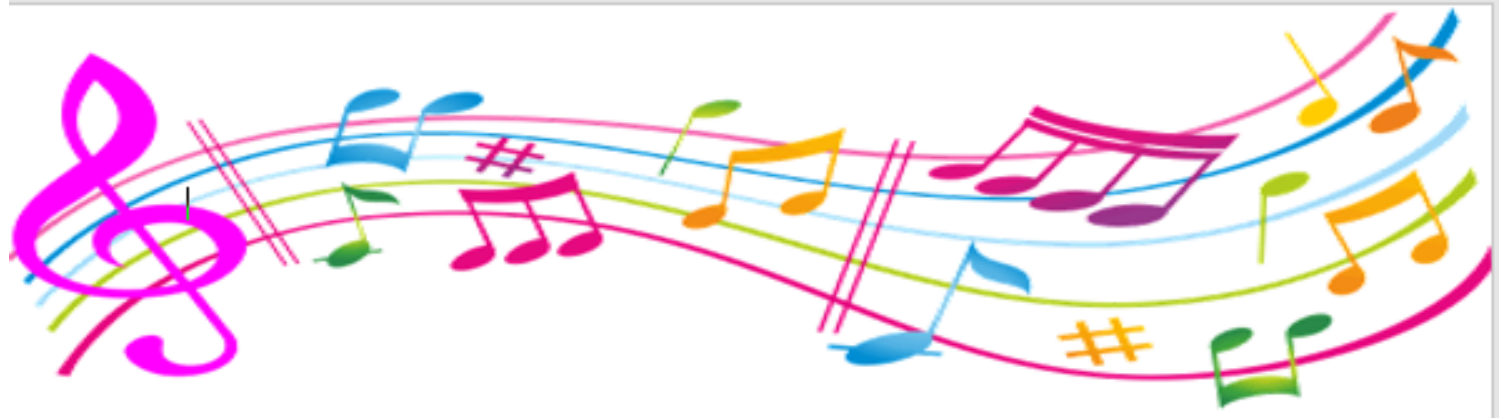
Thank you very much girls the Staff and Students really enjoyed having you here.
