One of the main aims of school is to get students enjoying books and reading. ## Year 6 Developing Their Photography Skills.

Last week, while the Year 5 students were hard at work in NAPLAN, the Year 6 students, under the guidance of Mr McInnes and Mr Learmonth, studied pinhole photography as part of their unit on light.

Initially the students created pinhole cameras using either small cardboard boxes or empty milo tins. After ensuring that the insides of the containers were totally blacked out, they made a small hole in one end.

The second stage involved making the chemicals that they would use to develop their photographs. The developer was made from mixing up a solution of strong mint tea or coffee with 2 vitamin C tablets and bicarb soda while the fixing solution was a mixture of lemon juice and water. The fixing solution was found not to work properly and, after some investigative work by Mr McInnes, a strong salt solution was used instead.

Finally the students loaded photographic paper into their camera while under the safety light in the dark room. Outside it was initially quite overcast which resulted in the students having to use exposure times of over ten minutes. Later, sunny skies would appear meaning that exposure times could be taken down to less than five minutes.

The developing process resulted in a negative image being formed (just like a negative from a film camera) and this was then changed to a positive image by taking a photograph of it with a phone and then using filters to change it. While not all photographs were successfully developed, some were produced showing clear images.

It is hoped that the Year 5 students will be able to have the same experience at some stage.

School Immunisation Program: Corryong College The second round of school immunisations is being conducted at this school on **Monday 29 May 2017**. The following vaccines will be offered on this day:

YEAR LEVEL	VACCINES OFFERED
YEAR 7 MALE & FEMALE STUDENTS	GARDASIL (HPV) DOSE 2 OF 3
YEAR 7 MALE & FEMALE STUDENTS	Varicella (Chicken Pox) 1 DOSE ONLY

These vaccinations are funded on the National Immunisation Schedule. Should your child miss out on starting their vaccination course this year they will not be eligible to receive them for free in subsequent years. Consent cards should have already been signed for these vaccinations earlier this year. If you DO NOT wish for your child to receive any further vaccinations or if you have any enquiries about the program or your child's vaccinations, please contact Wodonga Council's Immunisation Team on 1800 655 360.
