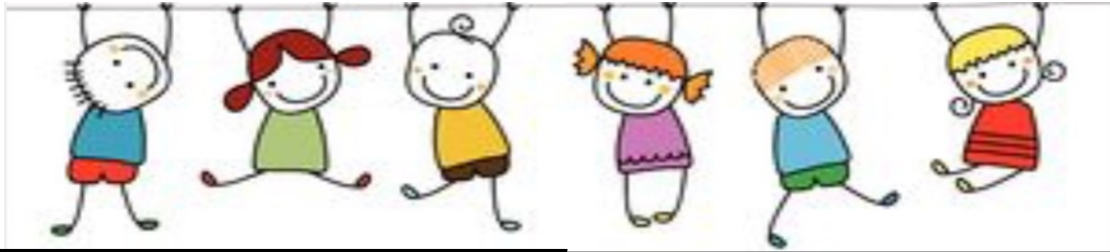

Bali and Back

26 intrepid Year 9-12 students of Indonesian language flew back in to Melbourne on Saturday night. Spending a week on the beautiful Indonesian island of Bali offered students an incredible opportunity to immerse themselves in a culture and lifestyle that presented both a new perspective about the world and a new appreciation for the good fortune of living in Australia.

Every day was packed with activities that challenged, amazed and enlightened. Whether attending language classes at the IALF in Denpasar or meeting with young people less fortunate than themselves at the Kupu-Kupu Foundation, our students demonstrated maturity, kindness and a sense of curiosity and humour that ensured every experience was not only of benefit to them but also to those around them.

For some, the highlight was snorkelling surrounded by hundreds of colourful fish. For others, it may have been the dramatic landscapes of the UNESCO Heritage Site of the Jatiluwih rice terraces that offered a glimpse into a way of life that dates back to the 9th Century. Then again, many enjoyed refining their bargaining skills in the markets of Kuta and Ubud (shopkeepers were less impressed.....!). Learning about the traditional art of batik painting saw everyone quiet and concentrating hard, while the adrenalin rush of the Bali Waterbom Park certainly provoked many smiles and much laughter. The world class cooking course sponsored by the CNC illustrated to the Year 11 & 12 students that Balinese food is not just satays and nasi goreng.

Temples, traditional dancing, delicious food, lush tropical gardens, friendly and welcoming locals, world standard accommodation and being immersed in the Indonesian language combined to lay the foundation for some incredible learning experiences and memories. 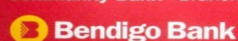
