I utilised the time to refine the Pre-Review Self-Evaluation of the College of which all data; teaching and learning as well as survey data, into a 49 page college analysis. This week all documentation and the self-evaluation will be submitted to Department. A huge congratulations to Travis whom is very humble about his winnings and said he was surprised he won after his final event; the wet work pattern.



On my way to getting my mother-in-law to tick off a long term desire to go in a helicopter, another Year 10 student, Tom Sheather, greeted us at the gate. In a short moment Tom had her, along with her husband booked in and on their way. It was after the flight that I found out that Tom was actually working towards his first solo flight. You can imagine I was quite awe struck! Wow, what an aspiration! After completing a four day intensive course, two theory exams and dedicating many hours of instructed flying with Riverina Aviation College, Tom completed his first solo flight in a Cessna 152 (two seater) aircraft during the second week of the holidays. Tom already has his sights set on doing the hard yards to get his recreational licence, after his 16th birthday. This will allow him to take passengers up to a 1500lb aircraft. Tom will build up his hours until he has enough experience to venture into other flight industries. He will also undertake his work experience later this term, at the Albury Air Control Tower to further his knowledge. Congratulations Tom! What an achievement already!

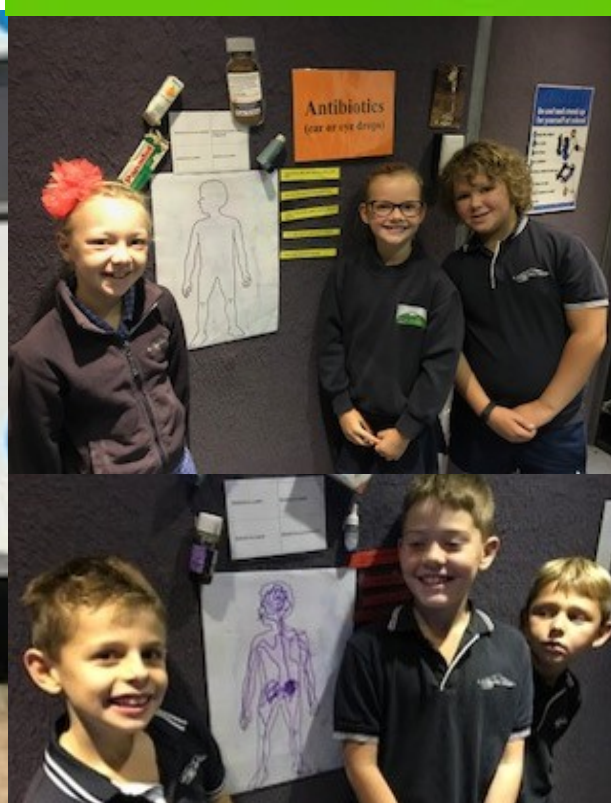

# Healthy Harold, Healthy Me



## ANZAC Day in the Upper Murray

As part of an investigation into ANZAC Day and what it means to them, students in Years 5 and 6 have been analysing a database of local men and women who enlisted during the First World War. this database has been compiled with the help of the Man From Snowy River Museum. This is what they discovered;

- Approximately 427 men and 2 women, who either went to school in the Upper Murray, or worked here either before or after the war enlisted.
- At least 52 of those served at Gallipoli.
- 81 men, approximately 1 in 6, were either killed in action, died of their wounds or died of illness or disease.
- 8 of those soldiers who died, died at Gallipoli.
- The average age at enlistment was 25.
- There was 1 Distinguished Service Order, 1 Cross de Guerre (Belgium), 1 Croix de Virtue Militaire, 1st Class (Romania), 4 Distinguished Service Medals, 5 Military Crosses, 4 Mentioned in Dispatches, 18 Military Medals and 3 Meritorious Service medals were awarded.
- At least nine soldiers married an English bride while they were in England.
- The majority of the men gave their occupation as labourer but others included 8 school teachers, 3 police constables, 2 hairdressers, 11 miners, 4 motor drivers, 3 motor mechanics, 4 saddlers (one of which lost an arm) and a host of other jobs.

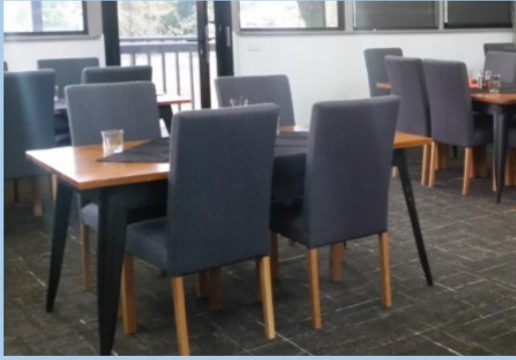
