Our finished books were then sent with a teacher group visiting East Timor. The books were delivered to the English Club of Fatuquero School in Gleno, a hilly and remote area of inland East Timor. The students were delighted to receive the books as the school does not have many resources such as books in English.

A big thank you goes out to our Year 2 students and Ms Leitch for facilitating such a great project.

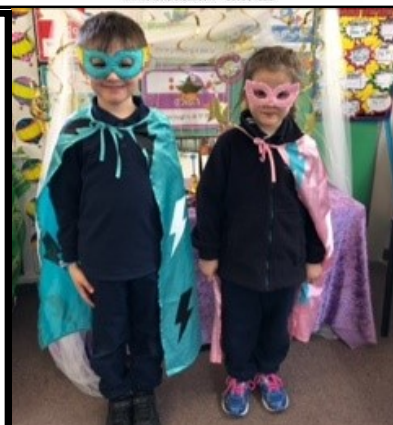
