PHONICS CODE OF THE WEEK

The Secret Codes – Whole School Phonics

The -ck rule

-ck is used after one short vowel at the end of a one syllable word to say /k/.

-ck can be used in the middle of words that have a short ending added (suffix)

e.g. Chicken, pocket, thicker

-c is used after:

*A short vowel in a multisyllabic word.

*When the next letter is a consonant.

e.g. picnic, fantastic, zodiac, maniac
